



# the CHALLENGE of HIGH ADVENTURE

On October 15th, 1979, the BRIGANTINE ROMANCE begins her second 18 month, 0,000 mile world voyage. Eighteen dedicated young men and women will be chosen to rew ROMANCE under the ship's officers. All hands stand regular sea watches, and share the rork, costs and achievements of sailing their own ship around the world.

There are over 35 magnificent square rigged sailing ships on the high seas today, but early all are government training ships. There is almost no chance for an individual to "go own to the sea" in square rig. *ROMANCE* is the world's only privately owned brigantine gullarly making long ocean voyages. To roam the wide world under sail is indeed an dventure of a lifetime.


The primary purpose of ROMANCE'S world voyage is to SAIL . . . to experience and ajoy life at sea in a traditional sailing vessel, not as a passenger, but as a full member of a indjammer's crew.

What is life at sea like? In the tropics, we live, work and sleep on the deck under the ade winds, sun and stars, a barefoot, healthy outdoor life. There is more to do, see and sperience than one short day can hold. Useful work to do, aloft in a cloud of snowy anvas, with the blue ocean sparkling below you, hauling braces, standing your trick at the heel, keeping lookout at night with porpoises for company. We spend our daytime four our watch keeping our seagoing home proud and shipshape, doing rigging and sail work, unding, painting, cleaning – the traditional duties of seamen before the mast. Yet in the agoing life, there's time for leisure and solitude; time to enjoy the beauty and wonder of the ever changing sea around us. Of sails swelling in the moonlight; whales blowing . . . the iss of the cutwater, the song of the rigging, and the fragrance of ship's bread baking.

Our second purpose is to explore the world's remaining lonely places. To leave our ay of life behind us, and live awhile with Polynesians, Melanesians, Balinese. To toil side y side with the descendants of the Bounty mutineers on Pitcairn Island; swim under Tahitian waterfall, dive for mother-of-pearl in a coral lagoon. To meet - and try to nderstand - a tribe just emerging from the Stone Age in the New Guinea highlands. o experience storms and calms, busy ports and lonely ocean passages - all the wide orld has to offer. Now. While there's time.

The world beyond the trade winds has been waiting for you since time began, Will it ways be this way?

the SKIPPER and his Ship






The BRIGANTINE ROMANCE is a celebrated world cruising, sail training vessel, and one of the loveliest of the world's Tall Ships. Her many major ocean voyages include that supreme adventure of every sailor's dreams an exciting 35,000 mile round-the-world odyssey in 1975-77. She has several South Pacific Expeditions to her credit, and explorations through the little known Western Caribbean, Mexico and the Galapagos, totaling well over 120,000 sea miles in the last 12 years. A going ship. Well planned, unusual voyages which continue to challenge the imagination and spirit of young seafarers.

ROMANCE is a sturdy Danish ex-cargo ship, re-rigged in 1965 by Commander Alan Villiers, as a true and faithful re-creation in cordage and canvas, of an 1850 brigantine. She is one of only two ships today to carry studding sails of the clippers, and holds the modern record of 26 consecutive days under these sails crossing the South Atlantic. ROMANCE is not a luxury yacht, but a true sailing ship, well equipped, through experience, for ocean voyaging. A lovely, comfortable and able cruising home, known to thousands through her many years of Virgin Island passenger cruises.

ROMANCE will call at a millionaire's hideaway, PUERTO VALLARTA; quaint and picturesque ZIHUATENEJO, "Old Mexico" in a lovely seaside setting; and glittering ACAPULCO-where the torch divers of LA QUEBRADA plunge off the cliffs into a shallow pool 118 feet below!


Now, ROMANCE spreads her white wings across the vast Pacific, beyond the Equator, and down the long, lonely road of the southeast trades, with only whales and tropic birds for company, until at last, a surf-torn rock rises from the sea... PITCAIRN ISLAND. Here apart from the world, live the decendents of Fletcher Christian and the Bounty mutineers. We'll shoot the surf into Bounty Bay-that alone a thrill of a lifetime-where old friends will welcome the Romance crew into their homes and hearts. As we live and work side by side with these stalwart 'men of the Bounty,' we sense being a part of this living legend, the greatest sea saga of all times.

The MARQUESAS, valleys of bamboo and tree ferns, ribbon waterfalls, and silent stone gods of Melville's poignant TYPEE. The colossal volcanic Virgins, and unearthly beauty of HANA VAVE BAY, FATU HIVA; HIVA OA, NUKU HIVA, and the cloudpiercing pinnacles of UA POU's 'Magic Kingdom.'

The low, shimmering atolls of the TUAMOTUS or DANGEROUS ARCHIPELLAGO, pearls-on-the-halfshell, spectacular shipwrecks and rainbow reefs. TAHITI! FIJI and darkest MELANESIA will thrill you beyond expectation. The NEW HEBRIDES, primitive bushmen of MALEKULA; slit-gongs and glowing volcanos on AMBRYM. Shark worshipers of LANGA LANGA in the SOLOMONS; never-never isles like TICOPIA, GAWA, KITAVA, KADOVAR-so primitive everything is thatch-huts, grass skirts, and ocean voyaging canoes with palm-mat sails. NEW GUINEA, spirit-houses and sing-sings and highlanders wearing tattoos and Bird of Paradise plumes.

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The island-studded CERAM and BANDA SEAS—ROMANCE's gateway to the mysterious ORIENT—FLORES, KOMODO(dragons!), SULAWESI, SUMBAWA, BALI, JAVA, SINGAPORE—a litany of exotic lands; temple bells, buddhas, rice paddies and exquisite Balinese dancing. Across the wide INDIAN OCEAN to COCOS KEELING, the forgotten MALDIVE ISLANDS, and the SEYCHELLES, the original Garden of Eden. ALDABRA—a nature preserve; and COMORO, an Arab city of dazzling white minarettes and colorful Bazaars. AFRICA! DURBAN and the game parks.
